TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

- Tuition is assessed on a per credit hour basis. The tuition rate for the 2025-2026 academic year is \$710 per credit hour
- The approximate cost per semester (including tuition and fees) is \$9,983, for a total annual cost of \$25,950
- Federal financial aid is available to assist in financing your education
- Edcor and EdAssist programs can reduce costs by as much as 15%

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor of Social Work or international Social Work degree from a CSWE accredited institution
- Minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 on a 4.0 scale
- Earned a “B” or better in all undergraduate social work and research method courses
- Advanced Standing eligible students who do not meet the minimum requirements for the ASAP Program will be eligible for admission into the 2-Year MSW Program

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Online application for Master of Social Work
- Official transcripts from every post-secondary institution where you received credit
- Two professional references
- Personal statement that addresses your desire to pursue higher education in Social Work
- Application essay prompt
- Field Education Evaluation

ACCREDITATION TIMELINE AND CANDIDACY STATUS:

The MSW program is currently in the pre-candidacy stage of the accreditation process through the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). We are actively progressing through the required steps and are on track to attain candidacy status during the 2025–2026 academic year. This timeline is fully aligned with CSWE's established standards and review process for new programs seeking accreditation. Once a program reaches candidacy, all students who were enrolled during the academic year in which candidacy was granted become eligible to have their degrees retroactively accredited once the program ultimately achieves full accreditation. This is a critical distinction, and we fully expect to attain candidacy Fall of 2025 — which would ensure that your degree, as an incoming student, falls within the required window for retroactive accreditation.

We are following CSWE's guidelines closely and are engaged in regular communication with them as we prepare for each step in the process. Our faculty, curriculum, field education structure, and administrative framework have all been developed with CSWE's Educational Policy and Accreditation Standards (EPAS) at the center, and we are confident in the strength and readiness of our program.
